

## MILO Range Training Systems Conducts Filming Events with USAF and ANG

### *New Scenario Development Targets Air Force and Air Guard Geo-Specific Training Needs*

Members of the MILO Range Training Systems’ professional content development team traveled on-location to Selfridge ANG base for a 2-day filming event to create new scenarios for their multi-screen 180 degree MILO Range Theater system. The material was modeled on actual events that occur at their location, scripted using professional actors, and recorded in 4k and 6k with MILO’s Ultra HD RED camera and audio system.

SSgt Jeff DeClercq, 127<sup>th</sup> Security Forces Combat Arms instructor played a key role in planning and executing the event. “Our officers are going to use this training to help them safely patrol, observe, approach, and de-escalate potential security situations.” Active shooter scenarios were also filmed at facilities on base. “Being able to go through these buildings a hundred times in simulation will prepare us if we ever unfortunately have to respond,” said DeClercq. “We get the benefit of learning the layout and planning our response without impacting daily operations.”

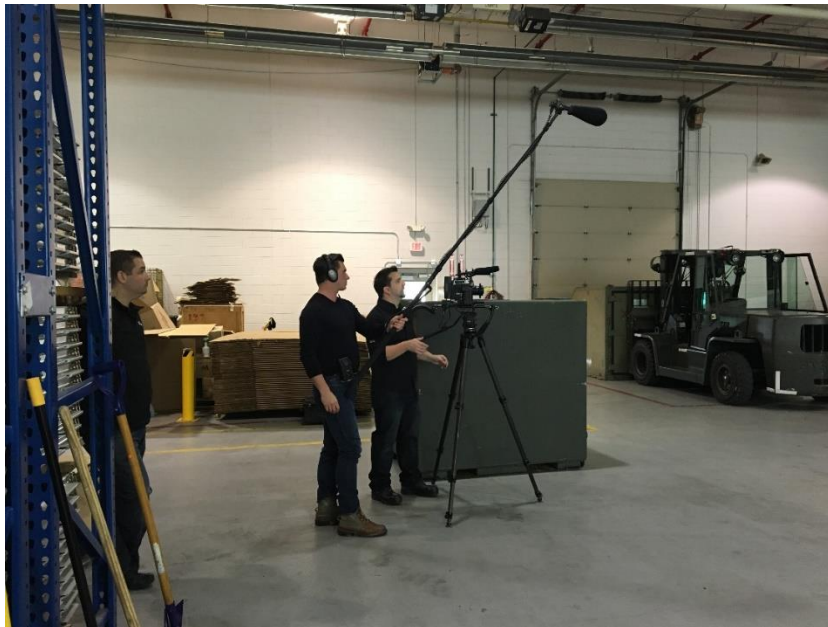


Meanwhile at the FAAC Ann Arbor headquarters, the MILO Range Academy training team hosted leaders from Kirtland AFB for a comprehensive training event. This academy environment was designed to supplement their existing training and arm them with more advanced tools of the trade. After filming their own scenarios and editing based on their specific unit procedures, the group went to Selfridge to observe their ANG counterparts during filming. “We spent a great day learning how to film and edit like a pro, and then we got to see the process in action” said SSgt Peter Creighton of Kirtland’s 377th SSPTS. “The expert tips they showed us are really going to help create some high quality individualized training.”



The units exchanged information and agreed to share their results. “One of the benefits of having so many USAF and ANG units using MILO Range systems around the world is they can film scenarios and share the content,” said Joy Creasy, MILO’s Military and Government Program Manager. “A unit that invests time in filming their own scenarios ends up with compounded dividends; not only do they get geo-specific training, but their scenarios multiply by sharing them with their peers in other USAF and ANG sites with MILO Range Training Systems.”
